February 2025 District Conservationist Report <u>EQIP</u>:

- Fiscal year 2025 Sign Up #1 29 applications ranked
  - 10 applications preapproved (34%)
    - o 5 funded via EQIP-CIC
    - 4 funded via RCPPS #2888 (Red Lake Watershed)
    - 1 funded via General Farm Bill Funds
  - Funded practices include two tree plantings, several pollinator plots, forage seeding, cover crop, reduced tillage, nutrient management, pest management, and several grade stabilizations.

  - 5 applications in Crookston
