# West Polk SWCD Soil Health Incentive Program

#### Definition/Purpose

- Cover crops are unharvested crops of grasses, legumes, brassicas or other broadleaf species grown primarily for erosion control, soil improvement and nutrient management.
- The practice can be implemented to support one or more of the following purposes:
  - Reduce erosion from wind and water.
  - Reduce water quality degradation by sequestering mobile soil nutrients.
  - Build soil structure and create organic matter
  - Provide habitat for soil organisms and beneficial insects
  - o Suppress weed pressure and interrupt pest cycles
  - Improve soil moisture management
  - Loosen compacted soil and improve infiltration/gas exchange
  - Fix and supply nitrogen for cash crops
  - Improve spring field trafficability

### <u>Policy</u>

### The purpose of this program is to:

- Help West Polk farmers offset the cost of seeding and terminating cover crops on a trial basis.
- Demonstrate the positive effects of cover crops on soil health and erosion control.
- Help farmers gain experience about the practical application of cover crops in our area and make their findings available to guide others.
- Encourage farmers to take the next step into reduced tillage and/or regenerative agriculture
- Promote the long-term adoption of soil health practices that build soil, reduce erosion and improve the resilience of West Polk farms.

Payment rate per acre:	- <u>Single species</u> : \$40.00 - <u>Multiple species</u> : \$55.00 (at least 3 species – grass/broadleaf mix)
Additional premiums:	<ul> <li>-Interseeding premium: \$10.00/ac.</li> <li>-Demonstration plot premium: \$15.00/ac.</li> <li>-Research cooperation: \$25.00 for treatment (seeded) acres (case by case)</li> </ul>
Acreage cap:	Up to 160 ac. per farm (20 ac. minimum)
Reenrollment:	Contracts expire after first year.
Eligible acres:	Preference may be given to areas with resource concerns and/or producers willing to participate in academic research or outreach/demonstration.
Time of payment:	Full payment will be made in the summer after successfully completing the practice.

## Terms and Conditions:

- To be eligible, enrolled cropland must currently be farmed and lie within the West Polk Soil & Water Conservation District.
- Only one contract will be awarded per operation.
- Any land already enrolled in a cover crop program or receiving payments is ineligible.
- Farms previously enrolled in the WPSHIP and those already using cover crops are eligible. However, applicants must either:
  - o add additional species to those currently being planted
  - o try different species/mixes altogether
  - o experiment with earlier seeding dates and/or interseeding
  - $\circ$   $\;$  integrate conservation tillage into cover crop regimen
- Fall strip tillage is acceptable on enrolled acres after the cover crop is seeded.
- Herbaceous wind barriers and nurse crops are not cover crops and will not be incentivized.
- Fall grazing is acceptable if it doesn't contribute to the cover crop's destruction before winter.
- Fall termination will void the contract.
- Fall conventional tillage will void the contract.
- Not every applicant is guaranteed to receive funding. Sufficient funds may not meet demand.
